Thefts from Campus Buildings

On Feb. 26, 2013, the University Police took a report of a theft of a laptop from Gallahue Hall and a laptop and iPhone from the Pharmacy and Health Sciences Building. The thefts occurred between 7:30 a.m. and 10 a.m. on the same date. All items taken had been left unattended.

On Feb. 25, 2013, the University Police took a report of a theft of an iPhone from Gallahue Hall. The phone was left unattended in an office space. There is no description of the suspect(s).

Guidelines to help prevent theft:

1. NEVER leave your room or office unlocked even for a few minutes. Thieves look for targets of opportunity.
2. Record the serial numbers of all valuables kept on campus, and keep the list in a safe place.
3. Keep a backup of important files (on BUfiles, an external hard drive, or cloud storage) in a separate location from the device.
4. Report crimes or suspicious persons to the University Police immediately at (317) 940-9999.
5. Students are encouraged to download apps that enable you or law enforcement to locate your specific devices. For Macs and iPhones, we recommend configuring iCloud Find My iPhone service on iPhones, iPads, and Mac laptops from <http://support.apple.com/kb/ht2526>.
6. We also recommend talking to home owner and renter insurance companies about adding devices to your coverage.
