Forcible Fondling

On Tuesday, April 17, two female students reported to the University Police that they were jogging in the 300 block of West 44th Street when an unknown suspect assaulted one of them by reaching out and touching her in the chest area. The suspect quickly fled on a bicycle and the students lost sight of him.

The suspect is described as an African-American male, mid-teens, heavy set and tall, with a short haircut. He was wearing a red vest or jacket and riding an older BMX-style bicycle.

This incident, as reported to the University Police, is a crime in Indiana.

Students, faculty, and staff should always be aware of their surroundings. Trust your instincts. If something looks unusual or an individual is acting strangely, call the University Police.
