Reported Voyeurism

This Timely Warning was authorized by Bill Weber, Assistant Chief of Police – Operations

November 8, 2013

On November 7, 2013 University Police were notified of an incident of voyeurism. The complainant reported that she was in a bathroom stall on the third floor of Jordan Hall when she observed a cell phone being placed under the stall dividers from an adjacent stall. The complainant left the restroom and waited for the suspect to exit. The suspect is described as a white male, 18-20 years old, 6 foot tall, thin build, with curly hair. The suspect was wearing dark, thick-framed glasses, a grey hooded sweatshirt, olive-colored pants and dark canvas tennis shoes.
